²³ These rules may seem wise because they require strong devotion, pious self-denial, and severe bodily discipline. But they provide no help in conquering a person's evil desires.

⁴ You adulterers! Don't you realize that friendship with the world makes you an enemy of God? I say it again: If you want to be a friend of the world, you make yourself an enemy of God.

⁶ And he gives grace generously.

ROMANS 5:12




When Adam sinned, sin entered the world. Adam's sin brought death, so death spread to everyone, for everyone sinned.
